BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AID — POLITICO's Shannon Young: With more New Yorkers reporting issues with anxiety and depression amid the coronavirus pandemic, advocates are calling on state and federal officials to invest in behavioral health programs, particularly those that serve children. A Citizens' Committee for Children and Healthy Minds, Healthy Kids report released Friday found that New York faced a children's behavioral health crisis even before Covid-19 ravaged the state. But that crisis has only gotten worse as children face new trauma tied to economic and housing insecurity, disruption in mental health care — including services provided at schools — and loss of loved ones due to the coronavirus. And the "harms of institutional anti-Blackness"

and police violence that children are grappling with" have further compounded those issues, the report noted.

... Advocates behind the report are urging Congress to "pass comprehensive stimulus legislation to help struggling families." New York, they added, "must continue to protect and invest in the children's behavioral health infrastructure," resist proposed cuts like the proposed 1.5 percent rate cut to children's Home and Community Based Services, make telehealth flexibilities permanent and support the behavioral health needs of students.
